LISTS OF PROHIBITED ARTICLES

These lists concentrate on generic descriptions, are limited to security-relevant items and do not include dangerous goods.

HANDLING OF PROHIBITED ARTICLES CABIN BAGGAGE, PASSENGERS, STAFF AND ITEMS CARRIED

The following articles are examples of articles which must never be carried in the cabin of an aircraft or into the security restricted area of an airport, except by authorised persons who require them to undertake tasks that are essential to the operation of airport facilities or aircraft, catering facilities or restaurants, or by flight crew who require them for the performance of normal in-flight duties. There may be other items about which security staff have concern and which may be confiscated if found.

Generic Definitions

- Guns, firearms and weapons - any object capable, or appearing capable, of discharging a projectile. Special attention must be paid to concealed or camouflaged items of this nature.
- Pointed weapons and sharp objects - pointed and bladed items capable of causing injury.
- Blunt instruments - any blunt object capable of causing injury.
- Explosive and highly inflammable substances which could be used to facilitate an act of unlawful interference.
- Chemicals or chemical substances, which could be used to facilitate an act of unlawful interference.

- Crampons
- Ice axes & ice picks
- Ice skates
- Lockable or flick knives with blades of any length
- Knives, both real & ceremonial, with blades of more than 6 cm, made of metal or any other material strong enough to be used as a potential weapon
- Meat cleavers
- Open razors
- Sabres
- Scalpels
- Scissors with blades of more than 6 cm
- Ski sticks
- Swords & sword sticks
- Throwing stars
- Tradesman's tools that have the potential to be used as a weapon including;

3. *Blunt instruments*

- Baseball bats
- Billy clubs
- Blackjacks
- Softball bats
- Cricket Bats
- Golf Clubs
- Hockey sticks
- Lacrosse sticks
- Billiard, snooker and pool cues
- Martial arts equipment including knuckle dusters, clubs, coshes, rice flails & num chucks, kubatons, kubasaunts
- Night sticks & batons

4. *Explosives and Highly Inflammable Substances*

- Ammunition
- Blasting caps
- Blow torches
- Detonators & fuses
- Explosive material or devices
- Gas and gas containers
- Grenades
- Fireworks
- Flares in any form
- Lighter fluid
- Mines and other explosive military stores
- Party poppers
- Petrol/gasoline
- Replica or imitation explosive material or devices
- Smoke cartridges
- Toy caps
- Turpentine and paint thinner

List of Prohibited Articles

5. *Chemicals*

- Acids
- Chlorine and bleach
- Disabling sprays including mace, pepper, tear gas and acids

6. *Liquids*

Unless in individual containers with a capacity not greater than 100 milliliters or equivalent and contained in one transparent re-sealable plastic bag of a capacity not exceeding 1 liter. The contents of the plastic bag shall fit comfortably and the bag shall be completely closed. Liquids include gels, pastes, lotions, liquid/solid mixtures and the contents of pressurized containers, e.g. toothpaste, hair gel, drinks, soups, syrups, perfume, shaving foam, aerosols and other items of similar consistency.

Exemptions may be granted if the liquid is:

- to be used during the trip and is either required for medical purposes or a special dietary requirement, including baby food. When requested to do the passenger shall provide proof of authenticity of the exempted liquid; or
- obtained airside beyond the point where boarding passes are controlled from outlets that are subject to approved security procedures as part of the airport security programme, on condition that the liquid is packed in a bag that is both tamper evident and displays satisfactory proof of purchase at that airport on that day; or
- obtained in the security restricted area from outlets that are subject to approved security procedures as part of the airport security programme; or
- obtained at another airport, on condition that the liquid is packed in a bag that is both tamper evident and displays satisfactory proof of purchase at airside at that airport on that day; or
- obtained on board an aircraft, on condition that the liquid is packed in a bag that is both tamper evident and displays satisfactory proof of purchase on board that aircraft on that day; or
- obtained from outlets located in an airside area beyond the point where boarding passes are controlled or in a security restricted area in an airport if the tamper-evident bag in which the liquid is placed displays satisfactory proof of purchase on airside at the airport within the preceding thirty-six hours.
